Background and Introduction:

Swat Relief Initiative strives to improve the lives of women and children in Pakistan through healthcare, education, economic growth and a sustainable environment. This non-profit organization also empowers societies through community development, social mobilization and awareness programs to help them achieve a better quality of life.

From 2008 to 2010, the Swat Valley in Pakistan had three major successive catastrophes. It began with a brutal Taliban takeover, followed by a massive refugee crisis during the resulting military conflict, and finally a devastating flood that brought further chaos to the region. This **short video** outlines the creation of SRI and some of our relief efforts relating to these disasters.

The people of Swat are still suffering in the aftermath of these events, which caused massive destruction of infrastructure and human life. While SRI started off as a relief organization, we have now transitioned into community development and have created programs designed to strengthen society and benefit the people of Swat. Our focus is on helping women and children — the most vulnerable and disadvantaged segments of society.

Preventive Health Care Program

In order to keep the importance of good health in mind, SRI in partnership with HDF had started its preventive health care program in 8 villages of UC Saidu Sharif and Islampur, which in 2016 have been extended to 9 villages. With the passage of time SRI Preventive health care program is growing and had measurable consequences and the awareness had spread on household level regarding health care measures and importance of good health.

SRI health care program is in coordination with all the relevant stakeholders in the district which always aims at promoting general health and hygiene measures by involving the citizens themselves in the process. Apart from that our aim is to reduce the risk of hazardous viral diseases such as dengue, malaria, hepatitis, diarrhea etc.

Major Consequences of SRI Preventive Health Care Program

- Health awareness had risen dramatically during the last few years
- Maternal mortality in the program villages has fallen to zero
- Hazardous and viral diseases such as dengue, malaria, hepatitis had fallen down to a reasonable number during the last few years
- The local villagers are now well aware of how to keep themselves and their family healthy by adapting regular exercise, eating good and healthy food and taking care of personal hygienes.

The main goals of SRI's health program are:

- Reducing infant mortality
- Improving maternal health, and
- Reducing the incidence of major diseases

The process of learning had started which will prove to be a useful intervention in raising the basic literacy ratio of the far flung village Gato Sar.



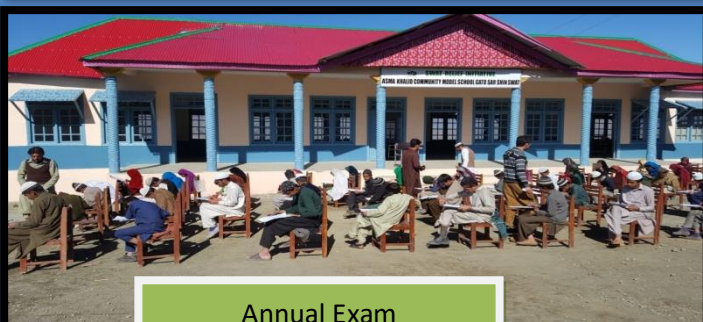

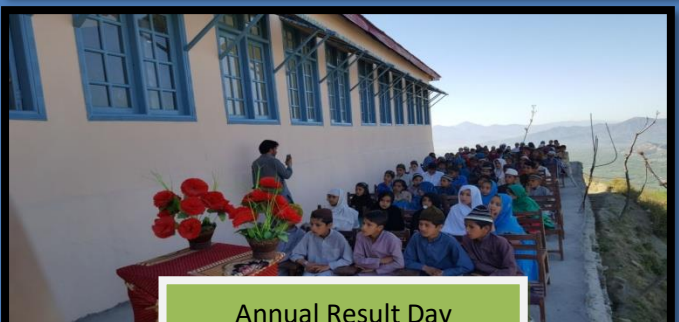

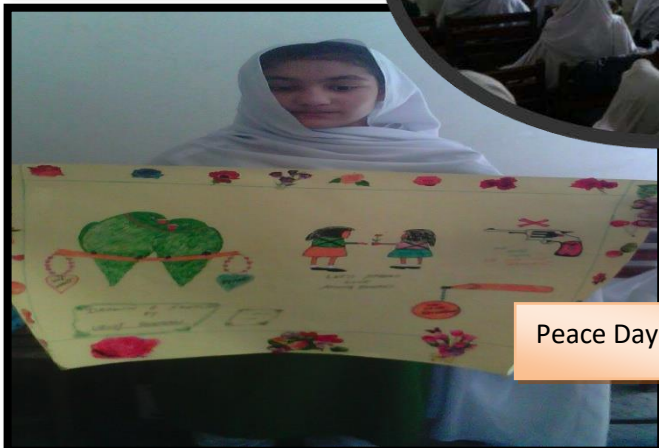
SRI Model school was further extended have 4 classes now i.e 6th, 7th th ,8th and 9th .
