Background and Introduction:

Swat Relief Initiative strives to improve the lives of women and children in Pakistan through healthcare, education, economic growth and a sustainable environment. From 2008 to 2010, the Swat Valley in Pakistan had three major successive catastrophes. It began with a brutal Taliban takeover, followed by a massive refugee crisis during the resulting military conflict, and finally a devastating flood that brought further chaos to the region. This **short video** outlines the creation of SRI and some of our relief efforts relating to these disasters.

The people of Swat are still suffering in the aftermath of these events, which caused massive destruction of infrastructure and human life. While SRI started off as a relief organization, we have now transitioned into community development and have created programs designed to strengthen society and benefit the people of Swat. Our focus is on helping women and children — the most vulnerable and disadvantaged segments of society.

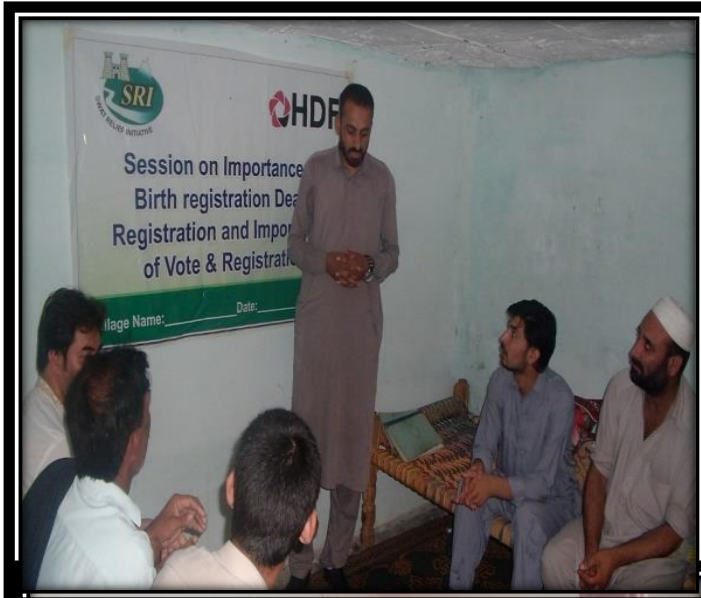

Preventive Health Care Program

Preventive Health Care Program

In order to keep the importance of good health in mind, the project was started with the establishment of a Community Health Center in Swat. More than 2,000 households were covered for preventative and curative health services through this CHC. The services encompasses providing comprehensive community educational services, infant immunization, TT vaccination for women, growth monitoring for children, pre-postnatal care to pregnant women and medical camps.

SRI Preventive Health Care Project in collaboration with HDF is now bearing fruits and the people are now moving towards better health measures.

SRI health care program is in coordination with all the relevant stakeholders in the district which always aims at promoting general health and hygiene measures by involving the citizens themselves in the process. Apart from that our aim is to reduce the risk of hazardous viral diseases such as dengue, malaria, hepatitis, diarrhea etc.

The project baseline was held in 2010-2011 to set the baseline values against the various indicators against the set goals/objectives of the project. Now in 2017-2018, the mid-term evaluation survey was held to measure the impact of the project activities over a period of seven years.

The Mid-Term Evaluation Survey has designed and initiated by Performance Improvement Program (PIP) of HDF. Project staff was involved and a team of enumerators was also hired locally for the survey.

Education

While keeping in view its primary objective of putting 20000 children to School by the year 2020, SRI had started construction of a Community Model School in the far flung village of UC Shin named as Gato Sar. During the year apart from Student Scholarship and SRI Model School Islampur, SRI had constructed 1 new school at Khawargaray which is soon going to be completed. Apart from that SRI had started the extension of Community Model School Gato Sar so that it can easily accommodate the newly enrolled students.

After the Baseline study conducted by HDF Performance Improvement Program the following indicators had improved dramatically.

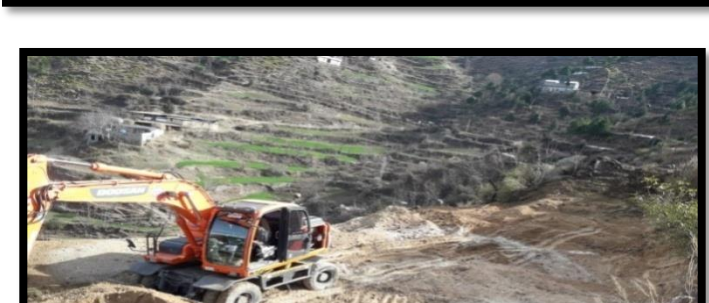

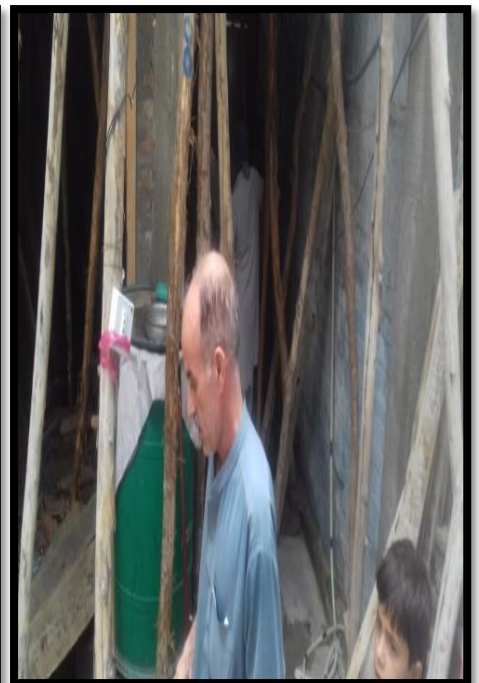
Deserving Family Support Program

Deserving Family Support Program (Small business support) Construction of Room for Abdul Jabbar and his family

Background of the Project

Mr. Abdul Jabbar who is the resident of village Barkalay Saidu Sharif Swat. He is the head of household and is the only source of earning bread and butter for his siblings. a nightmare of diabetes had severely affected Abdul Jabbar's health and he hardly managed to earn two times bread for his family.

Unfortunately the current Rainstorm had also effected Abdul Jabbar and his family that the only ray of hope which was their home, had collapsed and they had no shelter to live in. the community of Barkalay Saidu Sharif raised some money for the destitute family and with that money they had hardly constructed walls of the room but the roof structure is still to be put on and for that the Village development Organization (NawayJwand) and the local people had requested SRI to assist the family financially so that the roof construction can be completed and the family can be provided with a shelter to live in. it is worth mentioning here that Mr. Abdul Jabbar is seriously ill and he is admitted in the govt. hospital saidu Sharif to get diabetes treatment.



Provision of Wash Room for Deserving HH:

Background of the Project

SRI had its intervention in U/C Islampur since 2010. The union council is densely populated with most of the residents belonging to the weaving community where weaving is the profession of approximately 60 percent of its population.

With the increase in population the village is confronted with several problems including on top the scarcity of water, lack of proper housing facilities and sanitation.

Water and Sanitation:

One of the alarming issue that most of the poor households are facing is lack of toilet facility due to which they are compelled to have open defecation and this had brought severe health concerns in the congested population of Islampur.



Provision of Hand Cart to Deserving Family

Project Background

Mr. Bakht Kamal , who have been through the hard times of his life have seen lots of hardships. Being a labour in the coal mine factory since he was 12 years old and he had spent 28 precious years of his life in the coal drains in digging which had perished his health to a major extent. Apart from that his 3 sons and 1 daughter were physically disable which is an extra Burdon on him and above all he himself is not quite able to earn the livelihood for his family.

Upon the request of Mr. Bakht kamal SRI had taken his case and after the realization of his miserable status SRI had decided to provide him and his family the relief in the shape of purchase of hand cart along with fruits so that he can earn livelihood for his family by selling fruits and vegetables.



EID Bakra Qurbani

To involve the poor communities in the happy moments of Eid ul Azha SRI this year had also carried out Eid Bakra Qurbani in which several households of the poor communities were provided with Qurbani meat. A total of 65 households receive Qurbani meat.
